- The number of nonprofit organizations we serve


I am excited to share that ***we are breaking all of our previous records in each of these areas!***


Amount Saved for Nonprofits Annually



One of our most significant community impacts is the amount of money we help nonprofits save. By reducing the amount of money they spend on essential products, we increase the resources they have to deliver critical programs and serve our community.

So far in 2024, we have helped nonprofits save approximately **\$1,400,000** — an average of \$3,400 per member organization. By the end of the year, we're on track to deliver more than \$2.5M in savings — our most impactful year yet!

Pounds of Product Distributed



The volume of our operations has reached unprecedented levels. We've processed 114 delivery trucks so far this year — 73% of the total number of trucks we received in *all* of 2023. In the first half of 2024, we have distributed **650,000 pounds of new and like-new products** — 14,000 pounds more than we distributed in *all* of 2020!

All MCS products are new and like-new items that have been returned, discontinued, or displayed, and can no longer be sold by retailers. Typically these products would be discarded or destroyed, but through our unique program we are able to instead distribute these products to nonprofit organizations. The more products we deliver to our neighbors in need, the more products are diverted away from landfills — a win-win for our environment and our community!



As of July 1, 2024 we have **412 active nonprofit members** — 10% more than we served in all of 2023. Through our warehouses in Pompano Beach and West Palm Beach, we serve organizations throughout South Florida including Broward, Palm Beach, Martin, Miami-Dade, and Monroe counties. Their missions serve underprivileged youth, unhoused individuals, veterans, animals, and so much more — we are honored to help our members help others!

In 2023 we partnered with [Impact 100 Palm Beach County](#) to strategically increase our impact in South Palm Beach County. By serving more nonprofits organizations in South Palm Beach County, we are increasing the volume of products we distribute and reducing the amount of retail waste that is sent to landfills.
